TRAP'D – The Rhythmic Arts Project Downunder, is a program which allows people with various disabilities to learn to read, spell, count and basic life skills using hand drums and percussion instruments.

TRAP'D uses flash cards, dice, easy-to-follow guidebooks, calendars and other tools, teaches basic life skills, from spatial awareness and motor skills to mathematics, focus and visual, tactile and auditory perception. Participants sit in a half circle, taking turns as they follow instructions and sound out the beat to count, identify colours and shapes, and tell time.

In March 2013, Sydney based drummer Andrew Hewitt travelled to Santa Barbara, California and attended a specialised TRAP (The Rhythmic Arts Project) Training Seminar. As a result of this, Andrew has become Australia's first TRAP facilitator, which qualifies him to teach the TRAP program to people with disabilities all over Australia.
